

What Brought You Here?

What brought you to your church? As Methodists, you likely began attending your church because it was the neighborhood church. This is where our neighbors were and our children were with their school friends as well. You became connected and stayed. Even when you moved to another neighborhood, you stayed. Why?

If we dug deep into your reasons, I think it will boil down to the belief the church fit who you were at the time. It was relevant to your life and the life of your neighborhood.

There is no secret that churches are losing members. The main reason for the trend is that church quit being relevant. We quit being a part of regular lives. We quit being a part of community activities, secular and religious. We let sports leagues and other activities win over church. We were silent while voices on the extreme ends spoke for the church, creating an image of faith many will never agree with. We are quick to say we love God and Jesus, but we are not so quick to act in their names.

The church frankly lost relevance because we became more interested in making ourselves happy and comfortable than reaching out to those make disciples. We shifted into maintenance mode, as if we said, "We want new people, but we're not going looking for them. They can come to us if they are interested." Even our mission work became more about how I feel rather than truly helping someone.

We can regain relevance. I reissue a challenge that we look at our neighborhoods to see what changes have occurred over the years and what can we expect in the future. From there, we identify needs of the neighborhood the church should be meeting. Then, do it!

I cannot guarantee what the church will look like in ten years. I can assure that if we do these things prayerfully and consistently to regain our relevance, we will still be here. And we will be stronger than ever, making new disciples.


