The growing season for a farmer is not an idle time. While the crop is growing, the farmer is fighting weeds, watering, and preventing insect damage. Eventually the crop is too high to plow without breaking down the stalks. During this time, a farmer trusts that any weeds that sprout will be shaded out, or the crop is harvested before any damage can result. This is the "laid-by" season. During the time a crop is laid-by, the farmer may take a small break, but the work just changes direction in order to preparation for harvest.

The church also has seasons, but there is little or no laid-by time. Our neighborhood is the land that God has given us to farm. We are to plant, tend, and harvest a crop of disciples. That is why you hear me urging you to move from mission to mission and to create new opportunities to learn and serve. If you need a rest take it, then return to the work.

Churches that succeed, do so because they, show God's love through the work they do for others. Anything we do should be done only because it is needed, and we can fill that need. What we do is never conditioned on their agreement to become a Christian or to attend our church. Instead, make them want to ask why we want to do these things, which gives us an opportunity to share our faith. Our goal is to make our church a place where people can come to explore their faith among believers who are willing to provide acceptance, love, and support. That is the recipe for the creation of disciples.

A strange thing usually happens. Some who have not received help from our church see what we do and are intrigued. They come asking questions about why we do what we do, and the disciple making process begins again. Believers who are looking for a church home will join us if they believe us to be sincere in our service and intentions.

Our faith is constantly on display. What we believe and how sincere we are in it are always being tested. Don't be concerned that people are scrutinizing your efforts. This is not to show how good we are, but how good God is. The best advertisement for any church is a working congregation showing God's love in what they do. John Wesley said, "Light yourself on fire with passion and people will come from miles to watch you burn." Be loud and proud.
